Hospital System:

- **Arkansas Children’s Hospital (ACH)** in Little Rock, Arkansas is the only tertiary pediatric hospital in the state with a population of approximately 3 million. ACH is a 336-bed children's general facility with 14,550 admissions in the most recent year reported. The ACH Campus spans 36 city blocks and currently employs more than 4,400 employees. ACH has a staff of approximately 500 physicians, and over 200 residents in pediatric specialties. ACH is financially sound, constantly growing, and has been ranked by Fortune Magazine as one of the top 100 companies to work for in the U.S.
- **Arkansas Children’s Northwest (ACNW)** is a dedicated pediatric hospital in Springdale, Arkansas which opened in January of 2018. PIR physicians on the Arkansas Children’s team currently provide limited IR service at ACNW, which represents a tremendous IR service growth opportunity for the future.

Location:

Little Rock, the capital of Arkansas, is a low-cost-of-living, low-traffic, eclectic city on the beautiful Arkansas River.
