Seeking Qualified Candidates

Children's Healthcare of Atlanta and Emory University School of Medicine, located in Atlanta, Georgia, are actively seeking a full-time pediatric interventional radiologist to join our growing Interventional Radiology (IR) practice. With five full-time pediatric IR faculty positions, two IR advanced practice providers and a dedicated outpatient pediatric IR clinic staffed with a dedicated IR clinic nurse, our practice is one of the most robust IR practices in the U.S. focused solely on the care of children and adolescents. We also oversee a dedicated pediatric interventional radiology fellowship—non-Accreditation Council for Graduate Medical Education (ACGME), with one fellow per year.

Qualifications include:

- American Board of Radiology (ABR)-certified or board-eligible
- Completion of an Accreditation Council for Graduate Medical Education (ACGME)-accredited residency or fellowship in interventional radiology, or subspecialty certification in pediatric interventional radiology

Radiology Services at Children's

- Children's is one of the largest pediatric radiology programs in the country, performing more than 300,000 imaging tests each year. We cover nearly 650 inpatient beds across two hospitals, Scottish Rite and Egleston.
- Beginning in fall 2024, we will be operating five IR suites (three bi-plane units and two single-plane units) daily.
- Our practice has a dedicated pediatric-trained anesthesia team at both hospitals daily.
- In addition to a dedicated IR outpatient clinic, we also participate
 in one of the largest multidisciplinary vascular anomalies clinics in
 the country, with more than 700 new patient visits in 2022. Our
 practice performs more than 400 sclerotherapy procedures per
 year for these patients.
